THE SIGNATURE WORKS OF MARCY HEISLER AND ZINA GOLDRICH

Jones: The Musical* and *Junie B. Jones: Jingle Bells, Batman Smells*. These shows captured the voice of the irrepressible kindergartner with perfect pitch, both musically and comically. The songs are filled with the exaggerated emotions of childhood, from frustration to pure joy,

and have become favorites in elementary school music programs.
