Early Game Money Management

Instead, focus on completing story missions to unlock the stock market, which is the true path to wealth. Complete the first few heists to build a modest bankroll, and always check your Social Club email for Lester's assassination missions. These missions, when executed with the correct stock market investments, can turn a few thousand dollars into millions.

HEIST PLANNING AND EXECUTION

Choosing the Right Crew

When selecting your crew for a heist, you have a choice between cheaper, less skilled members and expensive, highly skilled professionals. - **Subtle Approach (Smart):** This requires stealth, disguises, and careful coordination. The payout is often higher because you lose less money to damage, and the escape is generally cleaner. Use Michael and Franklin for their precision and driving skills.

Advice: For first-time players, the Subtle approach is usually easier in the later heists, as it minimizes the chance of a catastrophic firefight. However, always choose the approach that best suits your team's strengths.

BUILDING AN EMPIRE: INVESTMENTS AND PROPERTIES

The Stock Market: Lester's Assassination Missions

COMBAT, DRIVING, AND SURVIVAL TIPS

Mastering Gunplay and Cover

Los Santos is a dangerous place, and police response is aggressive. To survive firefights, always use cover. The game's cover system is sticky, meaning your character will snap to walls and objects. Pop out only to take shots, and never stay in the open. Use Michael's Bullet Time to clear rooms quickly, and always aim for headshots to conserve ammunition. For explosive encounters, switch to Trevor and use his Frenzy ability to tank damage while eliminating threats.

Vehicle Handling and Evasion

Collectibles: Spaceship Parts and Letter Scraps

Hunting down collectibles is a time-consuming but rewarding endeavor.

- **Spaceship Parts:** Collecting all 50 spaceship parts unlocks a special secret vehicle and a fun side mission. Use Franklin to find these, as his map covers the entire area.
- **Letter Scraps:** Collecting all 50 letter scraps unlocks the ability to have a special vehicle delivered. They are scattered across the map, often in hidden or hard-to-reach locations.
- **Nuclear Waste:** Collecting 30 nuclear waste barrels unlocks a sonar dock and a significant cash reward. This is best done using a submarine.

Strategy: Use the in-game internet or a companion app to track your progress. Set aside a few hours to collect all items for a specific set, as this yields the best rewards for your time investment.

GRAND THEFT AUTO ONLINE: A SEPARATE WORLD OF STRATEGY

While the Story Mode is a contained experience, GTA Online is a living, evolving ecosystem. A complete **Grand Theft Auto V Strategy Guide** must address the unique challenges of the online world.

Getting Started in GTA Online

The online world is filled with both cooperative opportunities and player-versus-player conflict. Use passive mode when you want to explore without interference. When engaging in business sales, always use armored vehicles and avoid populated areas. The Oppressor Mk II is a popular griefing tool, so stay aware of your surroundings and use the "Ghost Organization" ability to hide your cargo from other players for a short time.

OPTIMIZING YOUR EXPERIENCE: SETTINGS AND MODIFICATIONS

Controller and Display Settings

Adjusting your settings can dramatically improve your performance. In the display options, increase the field of view to the maximum setting for better peripheral awareness. In the controls, set the targeting mode to "Free Aim" if you are confident in your aim, as this puts you in lobbies with fewer lock-on griefers. If you prefer a casual experience, "Assisted Aim - Full" is the most forgiving.

Vehicle Modifications

Upgrading your vehicles at Los Santos Customs is essential. Always prioritize engine, transmission, and brakes before cosmetic upgrades. Installing bulletproof tires is the single most important defensive upgrade, as it prevents your tires from being shot out during chases. For combat vehicles, armor upgrades and weapon mounts are worth every penny.

ACHIEVEMENTS AND TROPHIES

For completionists, Grand Theft Auto V offers a long list of achievements that span both Story Mode and Online. Here are a few of the most challenging ones:
